- employ a teacher minimum of 2 days per week to deliver 1:1 tuition in maths for pupils in Y2, Y3 & Y4.
- deliver our Easter School for Year 6 pupils revising for SAT's
- provide training for our new Numbers Count Teacher who will target pupils in Year 2 who are below age related expectations
- provide quality CPD in core subjects and the new National Curriculum for our teachers
- provide booster teaching for writing in our Year 2 class.
- Deploying experienced TA's to deliver focussed interventions
- Provide Computing After School Clubs

Impact of Pupil Premium 2013/2014

Our year 6 cohort of Pupil Premium children made very good progress to close the gap between our disadvantaged pupils and national other pupils to only 0.8 APS. This compares to a gap nationally of 2.4 APS between Pupil Premium and non-Pupil Premium children.

Across KS2 Pupil Premium made an average of 4.1 APS in Writing across the academic year demonstrating very good progress. This compares to 4.0 APS progress from our non-Pupil Premium children.

In Reading, KS2 Pupil Premium Children made an average of 3.9 APS across the year demonstrating very good progress. This was in line with the progress made by non-Pupil Premium children who also made 3.9 APS progress.

In Maths, Pupil Premium children also made accelerated progress with 4 APS across the year. Again this is in line with the progress made by non-Pupil Premium children who also made 4 APS across the academic year.

In KS1, Pupil Premium children made average points progress of 5.1 in Reading and Writing, this is slightly below non-Pupil Premium children who made average points progress of 5.4 in Reading and 5.2 in Writing. Both Pupil Premium and non-Pupil Premium children made an average of 5.2APS in Maths across the year.
