To the parents of children in Reception

Dear parents,

Welcome back to school. This year your child's teachers are **Miss Flynn, Mrs Right and Miss Hussain**. Please find below some useful and important information which will help you support your child in school during this coming academic year:

- The school day begins at 08.45 a.m. prompt (gate opens at 8.35 am and children go straight into their class) please make sure your child is on time every day. If they arrive after the register is submitted at 8.50, they will receive a late mark. The school day ends at 3.00 pm, please ensure your child is collected on time. (Gates open at 2:55 pm).
- We kindly ask parents to exit the school via the external playground gates. If you need to visit the office for any reason then we ask that you go out of the school and walk round to the front office. To ensure the safety of our children we cannot allow adults into the school except via the office entrance. Your co-operation in this is appreciated.
- Meetings with teachers must be made via the office and for the end of the teaching day. Teachers are not able to meet with parents first thing in the morning as they are involved with the children. Any queries, questions, messages can be left with Miss Keating or Mrs Gibbons in the office.
- Requests for extended holidays during term time will not be permitted and any such time taken off will be unauthorised and may result in your child losing his/her school place with us.
- If you are sending money into school please make sure it is in an envelope clearly labelled with child or family name, amount of money enclosed and what the money is for. Parents should use the money deposit box in the entrance foyer. **Monday is 'Money Day'**.
- Children will have access to milk, water and fruit throughout the day.
- **Class fund is £1 per child, per week. This money allows us to continue to provide a wide range of sensory activities on a daily basis. Baking activities will be organised in the classroom at least once per week. We will begin collecting this after half term**
- Children must wear school uniform in accordance with our School Uniform Policy – if you are not sure then please check with the office. Please make sure all items are clearly labelled with the child's name.
- In reception we learn outside in all weathers. Please send wellington boots and raincoats to school every day. Label these with your child's name.

- Classroom planning will be on display at the entrance to the classroom explaining the learning that is taking place for that period.
- The school library is open after school on **Tuesdays** and we encourage all parents to support their child to borrow library books and read at home regularly.

We are constantly striving to make sure that our children really reach their full potential. In order to achieve this parent support is crucial, our good teaching in school must be supported by commitment from parents at home. By working together we improve the learning experience for your child.

Important Curriculum information

In Reception the learning will be based around an Early Years foundation stage curriculum (Eyfs)

EYFS consists of 7 learning areas, the layout of the classroom and the specific activities set out have been chosen to stimulate learning across this curriculum. The children will also have group times in which learning is focused and subject specific. Group time will be twice daily throughout the transition period and will be based around: Mathematics, Religion, Communication and language, Phonics, literacy and Information technology.

The children will take part in a daily physical exercise activity which is dance based.

The seven areas of learning for reception are:

- Physical Development
- Communication and Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Mathematics
- Literacy
- Creative Art and Design
- Understanding the world (Science/It)

- **Your children will have sound mats in their bags, please go over these sounds every night. We also ask that you point out numbers and letters in the environment, encourage counting, and talk to your children about their learning.**
- **We aim for 100% attendance and punctuality for every child.** Good pupil attendance is an important factor for real learning. Our overall school target for attendance is 97% and pupils falling below this level will be closely monitored.

Please see the information sheet attached which explains how much learning your child will miss if absent from school.

Our **Autumn Term Parents Afternoon** will be on **Wednesday 18th October**, we kindly ask that **parents only**, attend Parents Evening for Nursery to Year 5 children. At the Autumn Term Parents Evening your child's class teacher will focus on how well your child has settled and this will include information on behaviour and attitude to learning. The class teacher will then report on progress against the targets set for your child in their July report and the new targets for the Autumn Term Some Autumn Term Dates we would like you to be aware of:-

Reception Reading Workshop will be held on Tuesday 31st October

*** Workshops are specifically for parents and we require at least one parent or elder member of the child's family to attend.**

Absence from School

Children are required to attend school for 190 days each year.

We aim for 100% Attendance and Punctuality for Every Child

Holy Family School's Overall Attendance Target is 97%.

Any attendance less than 97% is a concern and parents will be contacted by school staff.

Late Arrival at School

When your child arrives late at school he/she misses the teacher's instructions and the introduction to the lesson.

Your child may also feel embarrassed entering the classroom late.
