8.45 am to 11.30 am

This handbook is designed to support both parents and child to settle into our Early Years Foundation Stage.

### **Reception Session times are:-**

8.45 am - 3.00 pm (School gates open at 8.35 am)

Our **entrance to the main school** is in Oldknow Road.

### **Starting School**

This is a very significant step for your child and our aim is ensure a smooth start for him/her.

In reception we operate a staggered start, to ensure that each child is given full attention and support to settle in comfortably. You will be informed of your child's start date well in advance.

All Reception children attend school on a part-time basis initially, progressing to full-time when the Reception Teacher feels he/she is confident and able to cope with a full day.

We ask parents to:-

- Read and sign our Home School Agreement
- Get into the habit of being on time at the beginning and end of each session. Young children can be come distressed if they are the only child left waiting to be collected.
- Let the office know if your child has arrived late, otherwise your child may be marked as absent.
- Complete a data form with your current home/work contact numbers and the contact number of a second person.
- Inform our office staff when someone different is going to collect your child.
- Tell us if there are any changes at home that may affect your child at school.
- Speak to us at the end of the day unless the matter is urgent.
- Attend Parents Evenings and any other meetings regarding your child's education and welfare.

### **If your child is ill.**

Attending school every day is important. Children with coughs and mild colds should still come to school. You know your child best and if your child is genuinely too ill to come to school, then he/she should remain at home until well enough to return. If your child has sickness or diarrhoea they cannot return to school until 48 hours after the last time they were sick or had diarrhoea. If your child is not going to be in school for any reason, please inform the office first thing in the morning.

### **Toileting**

All children entering Reception must be able to use the toilet independently. **Please put a spare pair of pants/underpants in a bag in case of accidents.**

## Early Years Fund

The custom at Holy Family School is to ask parents to contribute £1.00 per week for school fund; the contribution can be made weekly or in bulk for the half-term (£5-£7 depending on number of weeks). This enables us to buy extra materials and equipment to enhance the children's learning activities as well as providing Christmas and Easter Gifts for your children.

## Reception Uniform

When children enter the Reception class they wear the full school uniform. Please see our School Prospectus or ask at the school office.

Some of the school uniform can be purchased from the school office, the rest from Asda or other high street stores.

Children should wear sensible shoes with Velcro fasteners.

Extreme hairstyles are not permitted.

Jewellery of any kind is not permitted.

Our Reading Book Bag with school logo can be purchased from the school office.

## Reception PE Kit (not needed until the summer term)

Slip on or Velcro fastening pumps.

Yellow t-shirt with school logo (available from school office).

Black shorts.

PE Bag with school badge (available from school office).

### **ALL CLOTHING MUST BE CLEARLY LABELLED WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.**

- Children are not allowed to wear any jewellery with the exception of stud earrings if your child has pierced ears
- Sweets, crisps, chewing gum and fizzy drinks are not allowed.
- Milk and fruit are available for nursery and reception children daily.
- Children are not allowed to bring toys into school.
- It would be helpful if you could provide a box of tissues to be used in your child's class.
- Children do sometimes take things from the classroom to play with at home. Please return any items that you might find your child has in his/her possession.

## The Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

This is a six term "play" based curriculum for our Reception children. Learning is planned to ensure that children are engaged in active discovery based learning. The curriculum for learning is planned across seven areas of learning and delivered following children's interests:-

- **Personal Social and Emotional Development** - learning to share, take turns, understand right and wrong and say sorry.
- **Communication and Language** - speaking, listening and understanding.
- **Physical Development** - developing early skills in gymnastics and games, developing healthy lifestyles.
- **Literacy** - developing early reading and writing skills.
- **Mathematics** - learning about numbers and shapes.
- **Understanding of the World** - investigating, exploring, finding out about God's world and an introduction to information technology.
- **Expressive Arts and Design** - art, music and dance.

## **Religious Education in the Early Years Foundation Stage**

At Holy Family Catholic School we teach children to respect other faiths. Our teaching follows the Archdiocese of Birmingham RE Strategy 'Learning and growing as the people of God.' Your child will join in regularly planned worship in a way that is appropriate to his/her age and understanding.

## **Supporting your child at home**

The most effective way you can support your child at home is to always take time to listen, encourage him/her to talk, read stories regularly, play together and go out together.

Each term parents will receive a 'Termly Learning Overview' which will explain the planned learning for your child that term.

Observation is the main form of assessment for learning and class teachers will report on each child's progress at parents evening.

## **Reception Lunchtime and Universal Free School Meals**

The government introduced **FREE School Meals** for all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 classes. Therefore your child will have a school meal in the dinner hall every day with their teachers and friends.

There is a wide choice of healthy vegetarian food. Good manners are encouraged and children are expected to eat with a knife and fork. ***Please teach your child to use a knife and fork independently.*** Once a term parents are invited to come and have lunch with their child.

## **Medical Information**

It is the parent's duty to inform the school by completing our 'Medical Form' if your child has any specific medical needs as this information is very important.

The school nurse will see every child in the Reception Class in the first few months to check height, weight, sight and hearing and you will be sent a consent form from the School Health Service.

We also employ our own nurse, Nurse Jo who is available for half a day every other week if you have concerns you would like to discuss with her.

Head lice can be a difficulty at times. The most effective way of preventing head lice is to wash your child's hair regularly and comb it once or twice a day with a fine toothed head lice comb (available from any chemist).

**Starting school is a big step for most children.**

**Parents are encouraged to take time to settle their child happily into their class. We want your child to feel secure about starting school.**
