On a very special baby hunt for God’s only baby Son.”

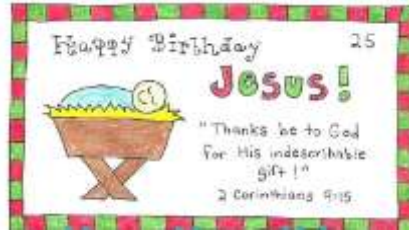
